




Daytona Beach International Airport (DAB) is a primary non-hub commercial service airport located at the nexus of two major interstates, I-4 and I-95, in east central Florida. DAB provides scheduled airline service to several large hub airports across the country.

With an on-site U.S. Customs and Border Protection facility, DAB is a user fee airport, connected to the global marketplace. DAB is the gateway for residents and visitors to experience the area's iconic beaches and events. It's across the street from Daytona International Speedway, home of the Daytona 500, and five miles from "The World's Most Famous Beach". Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University (ERAU), one of the world's premier aviation and aerospace institutions, is adjacent to the airport, and the university flight training program conducts nearly 400 flights a day through DAB. Based on FAA traffic data, DAB consistently ranks in the top 3 busiest airports in the state for operations.

DAB is home to four flight training schools, three full-service, fixed-based operators, the UCF/Daytona Beach Business Incubator and the ERAU Florida NexGen Test Bed. It also has property available for aviation business.
