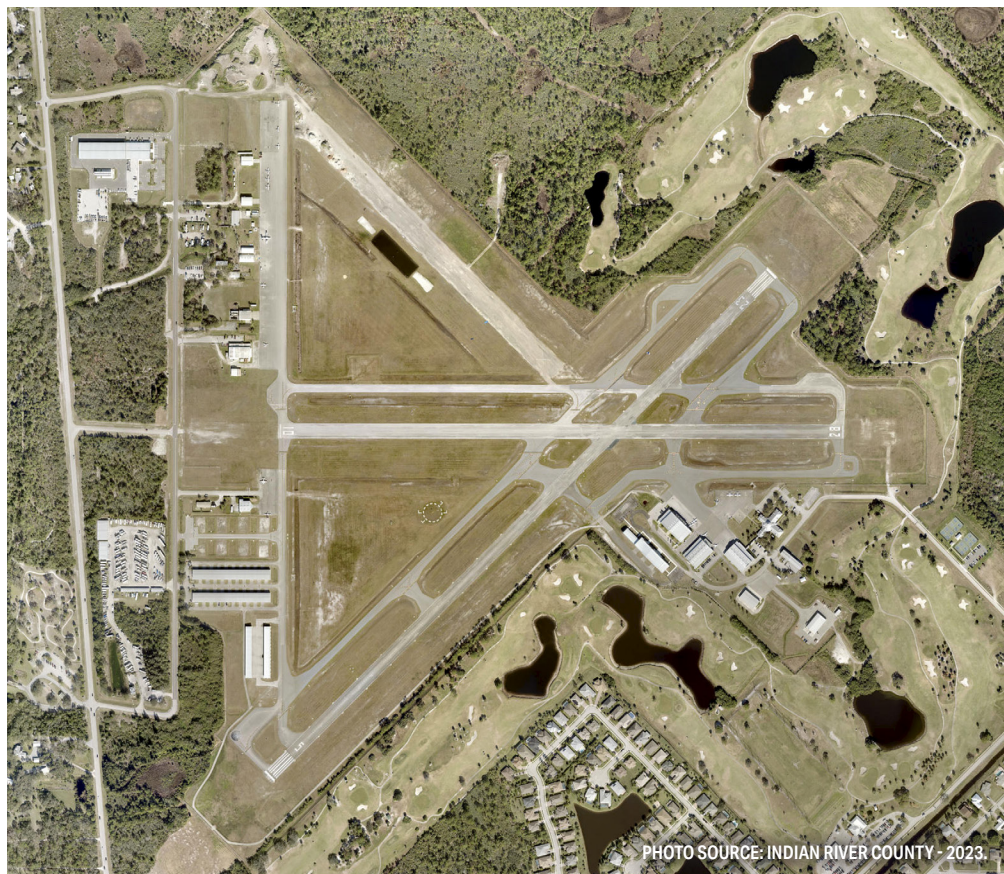


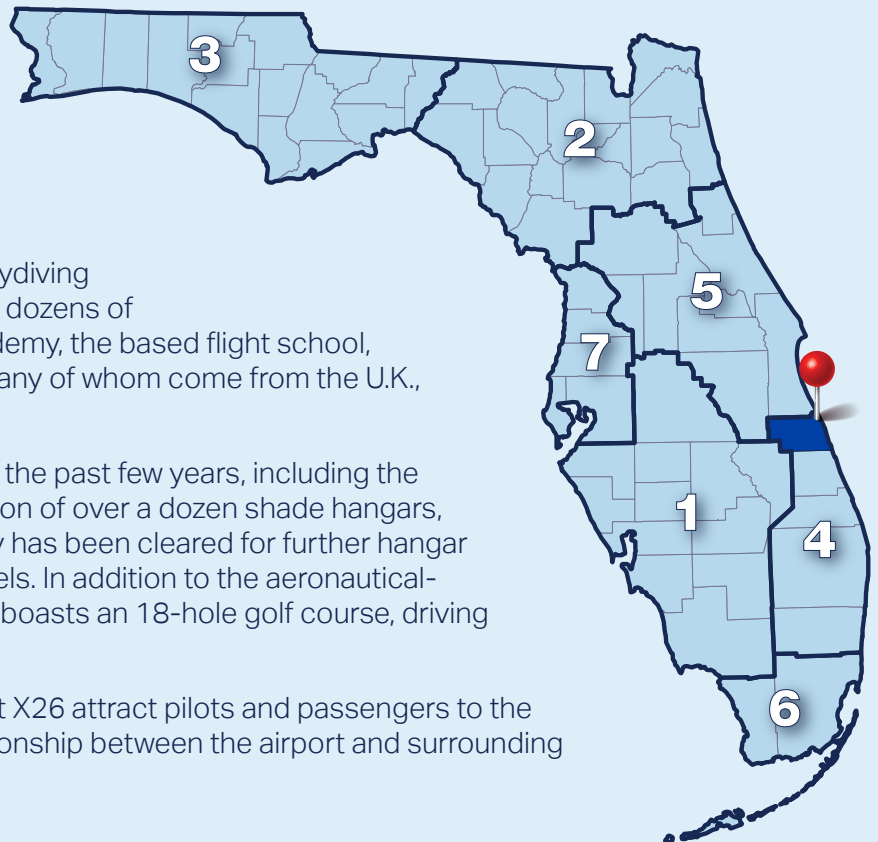

Sebastian Municipal Airport (X26) is a general aviation (GA) airport located on Florida's Treasure Coast. The airport offers two paved runways, the longest of which measures 4,023 feet long by 75 feet wide (Runway 5-23).

The airport most frequently accommodates skydiving and flight training. Skydive Sebastian conducts dozens of daily operations year-round. Wings Airline Academy, the based flight school, specializes in training international students, many of whom come from the U.K., France, and other European countries.

The airport has seen many improvements over the past few years, including the construction of two large hangars and installation of over a dozen shade hangars, with more of both to come. Additional property has been cleared for further hangar development to support increasing activity levels. In addition to the aeronautical-related activities supported by X26, the airport boasts an 18-hole golf course, driving range, and pickleball facility.

The amenities, services, and facilities offered at X26 attract pilots and passengers to the Sebastian area, further strengthening the relationship between the airport and surrounding community.

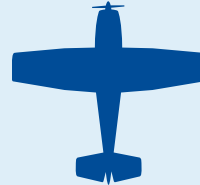

### Overview of the FASP 2043 Update:

Per Florida statute, the Florida Aviation System Plan (FASP) is periodically updated to summarize the airport and aviation needs in Florida while remaining consistent with the goals of the Florida Transportation Plan (FTP). The FASP 2043 Update focuses on reviewing the applicability of the various goals, objectives, and performance measures to support two primary goals: 1) provide for more efficiency in decision making within FDOT to support funding and development decisions, and 2) provide airports within the system with recommendations for development that support their individual missions while contributing to the overall strength and health of the Florida airport system.
