

Jump right into Zephyrhills Municipal Airport (ZPH), located in Pasco County, approximately 26 miles northeast of Tampa. The airport is publicly owned and operated by the City of Zephyrhills. The airport has two paved runways, the longest of which measures 6,201 feet long by 100 feet wide (Runway 1-19), and Runway 5-23 which measures 5,001 feet long by 100 feet wide, both capable of serving aircraft weighing 60,000 pounds.

The airport primarily supports many aspects of General Aviation flying and local business aircraft, with pilots either stopping to refuel or to enjoy a longer weekend visit. Pilots and passengers can have lunch downtown on Main Street at one of several local restaurants or experience the tranquility of one of several nearby natural areas, including the Crystal Springs Preserve, Hillsborough River State Park, or the Upper Hillsborough Preserve.

The Pigz In Z'hills BBQ and Blues Fest is also a major draw. This annual event showcases BBQ, blues music, classic cars, and a military history museum. The Zephyrhills Municipal Airport also supports frequent skydiving operations. Thrill-seekers from across the world come to train and experience skydiving at Skydive City Z-Hills. Other airport tenants include Zephyr Aircraft Engines, Hawk Aircraft painting services, POSOVA Aviation, skydiving equipment manufacturers and retailers, as well as other aircraft maintenance, repair, and detail shops.

### Overview of the FASP 2043 Update:

Per Florida statute, the Florida Aviation System Plan (FASP) is periodically updated to summarize the airport and aviation needs in Florida while remaining consistent with the goals of the Florida Transportation Plan (FTP). The FASP 2043 Update focuses on reviewing the applicability of the various goals, objectives, and performance measures to support two primary goals: 1) provide for more efficiency in decision making within FDOT to support funding and development decisions, and 2) provide airports within the system with recommendations for development that support their individual missions while contributing to the overall strength and health of the Florida airport system.
